
YOUR RIGHTS AT ALL TIMES



IMMIGRANTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- Ask the police to intervene and help.
- Request a protective order.
- Receive medical services and shelter in an emergency situation.
- Speak with their lawyer before speaking with ICE or law enforcement.
- Communicate with the consulate of their home country.
- Request a hearing before an immigration judge.
- Not sign anything or any document that you do not understand or in which you give up your rights.

YOUR RIGHTS IN YOUR HOME



IF ICE COMES TO YOUR DOOR:

- Do not open the door. ICE cannot come in without a signed warrant by a criminal court judge. They can only come in if you let them.
- Ask why they are there and request an interpreter if you need one
- Do not sign anything ICE gives you without speaking to your lawver.
- Don't answer any questions about your immigration status if ICE is in your home. Claim your right to remain silent.

YOUR RIGHTS IN THE STREETS



IF ICE APPROACHES YOU WHILE YOU ARE OUT IN PUBLIC:

- If you are arrested, do not say anything and do not sign anything until you have spoken to your lawyer.
- Ask the immigration officer if you are free to leave and if they say yes, leave calmly and in silence. Do not run.
